

# Autodesk® Fusion Manage Extension End of Sale FAQ

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## 1. General information

### 1.1 What is happening?

Autodesk is consolidating its Fusion Manage product offerings by ending the sale of Fusion Manage Extension, effective November 7, 2025, and unifying features under the Fusion Manage subscription. This update simplifies the product lineup and purchasing process while enhancing PLM capabilities for users.

### 1.2 Why has Autodesk combined the product offerings?

Fusion Manage Extension now includes the expanded set of features found within Fusion Manage, including automated numbering, along with integrated change & release management, as well as comprehensive cloud PLM capabilities for Fusion customers.

Customers will now access cloud PLM by purchasing *Fusion Manage*. New customers will access PLM capabilities for Fusion, through *Fusion Manage*, with the existing *Fusion Manage* pricing.

This coincides with the unification of *Fusion Manage Participant* and *Fusion Team* into one, rebranded, Fusion Contributor subscription offering. Learn more about those changes in the [FAQ article here](#).

### 1.3 How is Fusion Manage offered?

- Fusion Manage is offered as named user subscriptions, Flex, and through enterprise business agreements.
- Fusion Manage now provides Fusion Design & Make customers with full PLM capabilities.

## 2. Key dates, transition support, and subscription options

### 2.1 What are transition options for existing Fusion Manage Extension customers?

For product capabilities, existing Fusion Manage Extension customers' Fusion hubs have already been enhanced with new PLM administration tools and a process template library to add and configure PLM processes within their hub.

For offering changes, existing *Fusion Manage Extension* customers have the flexibility to renew their current subscriptions with either a 1-year or 3-year term until November 6, 2025. After this date, only 1-year term renewals will be available, and these may be renewed up through November 6, 2028.

After November 6, 2028, customers who wish to maintain access to PLM capabilities must transition by purchasing new *Fusion Manage* subscriptions.

### 2.2 When is the last day to buy standalone Fusion Manage Extension subscriptions?

The last day to buy a new standalone Fusion Manage Extension subscription is November 6, 2025.

### 2.3 When is the last day to renew standalone Fusion Manage Extension subscriptions?

The last day to renew a Fusion Manage Extension 3-year subscription is November 6, 2025.

The last day to renew a Fusion Manage Extension 1-year subscription is November 6, 2028.

*Example: The last day a customer can renew a Fusion Manage Extension 1-year subscription is on November 6, 2028, which means their contract expiration date would be on November 6, 2029.*

## **2.4 What subscription term lengths are available?**

*Fusion Manage* subscriptions can be purchased with a 1-year or 3-year term length.

## **2.5 Can existing Fusion Manage Extension customers renew to Fusion Manage?**

No, *Fusion Manage Extension* customers can continue renewing their existing *Fusion Manage Extension* subscriptions for a 1 year term subscription up until November 6, 2028 and for a 3 year term subscription until November 6, 2025. Any additional subscriptions required, customers will have to purchase new *Fusion Manage* subscriptions.

Existing *Fusion Manage* customers can continue to renew on existing *Fusion Manage* subscriptions.

## **2.6 How does this impact customers using Fusion Manage Extension as part of another subscription?**

*Fusion Manage Extension* is included in the [Fusion for Design offering](#). Starting November 7<sup>th</sup>, 2025 *Fusion Manage* will be included in *Fusion for Design*. No commercial impact.
