Connect data across every phase of the infrastructure lifecycle

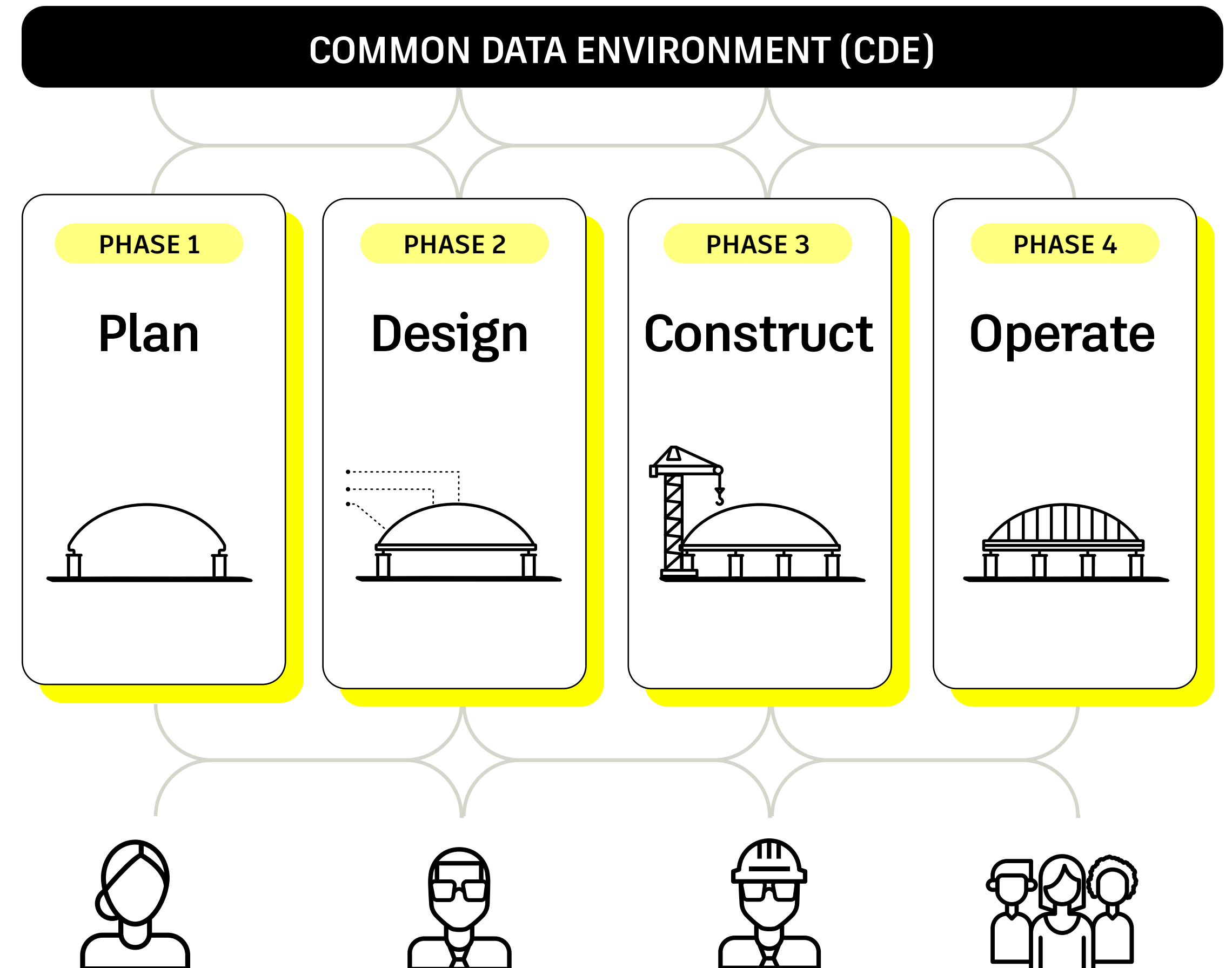
Infrastructure projects rely on information from many different systems, but that information is often trapped in disconnected applications and formats; especially with legacy solutions.

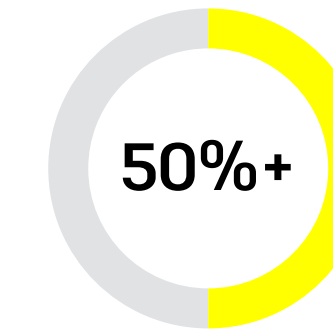
Autodesk's open, interoperable platform allows data to flow seamlessly across planning, design, construction, and operations.

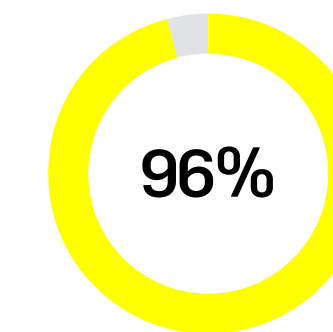
